often get the point with just a few words. Why did Jesus die on the cross? How did he rise from the dead? Where is he now?

Only three simple questions, but enough material for an entire series of sermons around Easter. What would you have answered?

Faith lives through discussion, even when it feels like we don't have the perfect answers. When you speak about faith with the young and old, you can easily respond back: Well, what do you think? And who knows, maybe you will gain a new perspective through this dialogue.



As a trained theologian, I know the terrifying moment when you think: I can't explain this completely. The next minute though I think of a

quote by Saint Francis: "Even if you know little, preach it." And I would add, for the rest we can search for the answers together.

With our new Luther statue, which is criss-crossing Toronto, we are sparking conversations. Many people have already learned what is important to us from a Lutheran perspective on faith.

"You are saved by grace alone"- many of us have learned this in Confirmation class as the core of the Lutheran perspective. And how would you explain this today? I would say: I believe in a loving God, who doesn't judge me for



my faults, but who instead takes me in his arms even when everything goes wrong. My life has value not because of my achievements but instead because God loves me. This allows me to breathe freely and to live freely, in service to others.

And what would you talk about?

Do you have the courage to put faith into action and to also bring into conversations? Share what is important to you, with the young and old.

I wish you a blessed time of Lent and a liberating Easter in April.

World Day of Prayer at Martin Luther Church on March 6th

White sandy beaches, coral reefs, crystal clear water: all this is found around the 700 islands of the Bahamas. Located between the USA, Cuba and Haiti, this island state is a dream come true for tourists. The Bahamas are marked as the richest Caribbean country. In addition it offers a multitude of Christian denominations.

But problems trouble paradise: extreme dependence from other countries, high unemployment rates and domestic violence against women and children.

Both sides of the coin come to light in the service written by the women of the Bahamas for the World Day of Prayer 2015. The central part is dominated by the reading of John (13:1-17) where Jesus washes the feet of his disciples. In the midst of violence and poverty this passage speaks to the women of the Bahamas as they discover Jesus active charity in this simple act.

All around the world women celebrate services on the 6th of March 2015 as part of the World Day of Prayer.

This year Martin Luther Church hosts this special event for all German Lutheran congregations in the GTA. We start with the service at noon and finish with a lunch provided afterwards. Men are also very much invited!

News from ELCIC, EKD and DELKINA

Our Congregation is a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada (ELCIC) and the Eastern Synod. We are partnered with the Evangelical Church in Germany (EKD) and member of the Deutsche Evangelisch-lutherische Konferenz in Nordamerika (DELKINA).

New Structure in the ELCIC: Toronto Central Area lead by Dean Ilze Kuplens Ewart

The ELCIC transformed the old Conferences into a new area-structure. The Martin Luther Church is now part of a group of 20 congregations belonging to the Toronto Central Area. This new structure aims to improve the cooperation between congregations.

Chair person of our Area is Dean Ilze Kuplens-Ewart, who is also the Pastor at St. Andrews, a Latvian congregation.

She is supported by the following team of leaders: David Berg (First Lutheran), Andrew Slonetsky (Holy Cross, Newmarket), Pastor Brian Wilker-Frey and Pastor Christian Ceconi.

The first big action item the Area team took on is the preparation of a **Seminar day on the 25. April. At 9am** all council members, persons in leadership positions or interested parties are invited to learn more about the topic Leadership and how best to teach and learn from and with each other.
