Countless thoughts run through your mind on the eve of the Advent season: Where did I put the candles for the Advent wreath? When will we bake the cookies this year, so that the timing is perfect and everything is ready for Christmas? And the noble goal: This year I'll already have everything done a week before Christmas, so that we can enjoy the holidays in peace.

A hymn comes to mind in the middle of these thoughts: Fling wide the door, unbar the gate! My favourite hymn for the Advent season, not just because it is number 1 in the German hymn book, but also because it is so cheery and full of movement. After all it is exactly this vibrancy and ease that I need in light of the flood of thoughts at Advent.

As the same time it reminds me what Advent is about: not about the "doing", but about making room. You can't do anything to make God arrive in the world; you can only make room for it. Taking time to listen and to see, to be quiet and to talk; this is what sets Advent apart. A time of mindfulness where we are aware of God's work in the world around us, where we open our hearts to God.

Therefore make room in your life for yourself and for God. This will do you good and give you the ease that then allows us to cheerfully join in singing the Advent hymn in three-four time: "Come, Lord, our Savior, Jesus Christ; our hearts are open wide in trust. Oh, show us now your lovely grace, upon our sorrows shine your face..."

Peace Light

Each year, a child from Upper Austria fetches the light from the grotto in Bethlehem where Jesus was born. The light is carried in two blast proof miners lamps on an Austrian Airlines jet from Tel Aviv Israel to Vienna (Austria) from where it is distributed at a Service of Dedication to delegations from across Europe who take it back, with a message of Peace, to their own countries. Austrian Airlines then flies the miner's lamps containing the Peace Light from Bethlehem to New York City from where it is distributed in North America.

On December 3 it will arrive at the Christmas Market in Toronto's Distillery District and Martin Luther Church will bring it to the Lakeshore and pass it on during the candlelight service on the 4th Sunday of Advent. Bring a lantern to take it home and to bring the light of peace to all your friends.

Maybe you'd like to volunteer to bring the light to our church on December 3. If so, please contact the church office.


Christmas Play on the Third Sunday of Advent, December 11

Pope Francis, LWF President Younan and General Secretary Junge Inaugurate Historic Commemoration of the Reformation

Pope Francis, LWF President Bishop Dr Munib A. Younan and LWF General Secretary Rev. Dr Martin Junge led an event in which the Catholic Church and the Lutheran World Federation declared commitment to move away from conflict, journey towards communion and strengthen joint witness. The historic gathering in Sweden is the first ever Catholic-Lutheran joint commemoration of a Reformation anniversary at a global level.

The head of the worldwide Catholic Church and leaders of The Lutheran World Federation (LWF) co-hosted the Joint Catholic-Lutheran Commemoration of the Reformation consisting of a Common Prayer in Lund Cathedral with the participation of 500 people and a public event attended by some 10,000 people in the nearby Malmö Arena, and followed by people all over the world in live broadcasts and live streams.

Pope Francis told worshippers that "in the context of the commemoration of the Reformation of 1517, we have a new opportunity to accept a common path, one that has taken shape over the past fifty years in the ecumenical dialogue between The Lutheran World Federation and the Catholic Church."

In his sermon, Junge emphasized that both Lutherans and Catholics have "much more that unites us than that which separates us. We are branches of the same vine. We are one in Baptism. This is why we are here at this joint commemoration: to rediscover who we are in Christ."

Joint Statement

A highlight of the service was the signing of a Joint Statement by Pope Francis and President Younan. The document expresses gratitude to God for the sustained and fruitful ecumenical dialogue between Catholics and Lutherans, in which mutual understanding and trust has deepened. It states both partners "are no longer strangers," having grown closer through dialogue and shared witness.

In the joint statement, Catholics and Lutherans express gratitude for the "spiritual and theological gifts received through the Reformation." They confess and lament that they have wounded the visible unity of the Church because of the prejudice and conflicts that accompanied their theological differences, and became instrumentalized for political ends.

The statement emphatically rejects "all hatred and violence, past and present, especially that expressed in the name of religion."

Faith and baptism in Christ, they state, "demand of us a daily conversion, by which we cast off the historical disagreements and conflicts that impede the ministry of reconciliation." They acknowledge that "while the past

cannot be changed, what is remembered and how it is remembered can be transformed.”

Towards Increased Cooperation in Serving the Needy

At the Malmö Arena activities held under the theme “Together in Hope”, LWF’s Lutheran World Service director Maria Immonen and Caritas Internationalis Secretary General Michel Roy signed a Declaration of Intent mutually committing the global Christian organizations to deepened relationships and closer cooperation in humanitarian response and sustainable development. The arena staged performing artists and testimonies by Lutheran and Catholic advocates for social justice and climate issues from Burundi, Colombia, India, South Sudan and Syria. Pope Francis and LWF President Munib Younan offered responses to their testimonies.

EKD/Europe: Travel Stories

From Europe the Reformation extended to other continents, shaped cultures and regions. As of November 2016 the “Europäische Stationenweg” is making a recording and leads to the world fair Reformation in Wittenberg.

A truck is travelling through 19 European countries and is collecting Reformation stories from the 500th century. The truck is bringing all the stories from

Sibiu and Dublin, from Rome and Turku, from Zürich, Villach and Schmalkalden, from Worms, Augsburg and Osnabrück and from all the other stations to the Luther-town Wittenberg. Travel Stories are not just happening on 67 stations between November 3, 2016 and May 20, 2017 in the “story mobile truck”, but are also available any time online. Accompany the truck on its tour and live (or relive) what stories unfold on this journey.
