Passionate About Resurrection

Over the past few months that I've gotten to know many churches in our Central Toronto Ministry Area better. It has become clear: We are not the only congregation in transition. In many instances traditional programs are giving way. In many congregations, membership numbers, as well as Sunday worship service attendance, are going down. Often a certain amount of helplessness spreads, sometimes even frustration or grief. Questions arise: what will become of the church in the future? Are we in the last throes and will we have to shut our doors at some point?

At our last area meeting, a colleague said, "Do not forget, we're in the resurrection business!" And I thought, right she is! Jesus preached: because I live, you also will live! (John 14:19) He says this verse in his farewell speeches as the disciples worry about the future of the Jesus movement. A few days later, they experience that these words of Jesus are not an empty promise. In the resurrection of Jesus on Easter morning, God has affirmed the message that he brings things to life, where we first see death.

The first disciples were witnesses of this transformational power and we still are to this day. Sometimes we are like Mary. John recounts that she was in the garden by the tomb. When she sees the Risen Lord, she first thinks he is the gardener. Crying, she asks him where the body of Jesus has ended up. Only when the Risen One addresses her by name does she recognize him and see the new reality. Her eyes are opened.

Like Mary, we sometimes have to painstakingly learn to see the reality of the resurrection—even in the life of the church. New forms of church have long been growing and the Risen One is at work all throughout the world. Where we see old practices dying away, and we are still in the process of mourning, already new life begins to grow, sometimes unexpected and strangely unfamiliar.

Let us search passionately for signs of resurrection. Let's search passionately for a church that appeals to people's yearning for life today. Easter brings an end to the sorrow brought about by death. The joy of new life is taking hold and we are fired up to have a say about it.

- b) Work on communication effectiveness (with council, at roundtable, to the congregation)
 - internal communication
- c) Find 3 simple ways of member appreciation and establish them.

3. Growing the Congregation

- a) Council will support Family Camp Sunday Team and provide resources as necessary.
- b) Establish an outreach team by January 2018. Try out new ways of engaging with our neighbours.

4. Building. The. Future.

- a) Finish 5 Superior HVAC by May 2018.
- b) Support the committee in drafting a concept for the altar area renewal by February 2018 and get approval by AGM 2018. Make it happen.
- c) Decide future furniture by January 2018 and begin

purchasing for back room.

- d) Initiate dialogue with Daycare about backyard re-modeling. Invite daycare leadership for council meeting in January 2018.

If you are inspired by one of our priorities or if you have a talent that could help us achieve our priorities, please let us know. Your talents are always appreciated!

Ernst Carl, who served for many years on Council, has decided to step down. He is still part of the Maintenance team and is always available to come to church or 5 Superior to help with any and all issues that come up. Thank you for your dedication to MLC and for all your support and hard work.

Farewell Interview with Vicar Thara

In April 2017 our congregation welcomed Vicar Thara Klein from Germany with great joy. Although this feels like just yesterday, it is now almost time to say goodbye—we sat down with Thara as she reflected on her past year at MLC and in Toronto.

Q: You spent one year as a vicar at MLC—looking back at the past year, do you have one memorable moment that you would like to share with us?

A: I remember that one Sunday, I was really unhappy with my sermon; after the service, however, a man came to me and told me that he was so glad that our doors were open, because he had just lost his mother and needed a place to go. Such moments make me realize what a huge privilege and blessing it is to work as a vicar/pastor. That feeling is amazing and humbling at the same time.

Q: Did anything take you by surprise at our church?

A: In Germany, I'd never had to share an office with anyone. I had expected that it would take me a long time to get used

to being surrounded by people for so many hours every week. But right from the beginning, the atmosphere at the office was so amazing that it actually helped me do a better job.

Q: Shortly after arriving from Germany, you expressed your desire to explore new ways of worship and fellowship, as well as to discover the role of the Church in our changing society. Were you able to find some answers during your stay in Toronto?

A: One thing that comes to my mind is that the indigenous bishop asked us at the end of the reformation procession to think about the following question: "How and where are we supposed to preach the Gospel nowadays?" I think there are countless ways we can experience worship and fellowship; there are countless places and forms to preach the Gospel. Finding new ways of doing this without giving up the old ways is part of the church's mission. Know who you are (as a Christian, as a congregation), know what your mission is about, and find your own way of pursuing it so that the world can hear the good news. You can preach the Gospel on a Sunday morning in a church or on a Wednesday morning with your drum in front of the church.



Q: Did you get a chance to see and explore a bit of Canada in your free time?

A: In July, I took the train to Ottawa, Québec City and Montréal, and in September, our former intern Alena and

I flew to Saint John and then drove to Moncton, Hopewell Cape, Halifax, Peggy's Cove, Lunenburg and then (via ferry) back to Saint John.

Q: Now that your time at MLC has come to an end—what awaits you next?

A: At the end of April, I will find out in which congregation within the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Northern Germany (Nordkirche) I will become a pastor. In June, I will officially begin my work, and in the same month I will be ordained.

It is always sad when we have to say goodbye—that goes without saying for Thara, our fantastic vicar. We thank her for all the work she has done for our church and the community, and wish her the best as she moves on to new opportunities in Germany! On April 22 we will send Thara off during the joint service at 11:00 am. All are welcome to wish her godspeed.
