Let the Word of Christ dwell among you!

Community arises when you do something together. For example, when our vicars assemble IKEA furniture together, or when our seniors sing together. When our youth plan the summer camp or cook together. When we celebrate worship together every Sunday.

Community with each other and with God arises when we do something with God. When we pray together, comfort and encourage each other, sing, read the Bible, help people and celebrate life. Building a community in which we and many others experience and deepen fellowship with God is important to us as a congregation. At the National Convention of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada (ELCIC), our national bishop Susan Johnson encouraged us to do so. She invited the whole church to deepen fellowship with God: "I am inviting the entire church to join me in a new four-year emphasis on Living our Faith, as together we pray, read, worship and love." And we as Martin Luther Church are taking part!

Last year we focused on giving more space to shared prayer. We talked about it at meetings and learned from each other how we pray. We found different answers to questions such as: Would you pray in a restaurant before eating?

This year the focus is on reading the Bible. Paul wrote in his letter to the Colossians (3:15): Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God.

Letting the word of Christ live with us means having it with you: on the sofa, on the smartphone and as an audio book in the car. I installed an app on my smartphone that provides two Bible verses for each day. I have made it my goal that I open this app first thing every morning so that the day can also begin with God's Word on the phone.

What ideas do you have about how the Word of Christ can dwell abundantly with us? I am excited to hear about them!



Peace Quilt

Together we were able to make a substantial difference in the lives of people in need and to continue to build our community.

Fundraising Concert at Martin Luther Church by the Toronto Welsh Male Voice Choir

The Refugee Support Team at MLC, headed by Anneli and Greg Andre-Barrett, organized a fundraising concert at MLC in support of 3 refugee families being sponsored by the church to come and settle in Canada. The proceeds will be used to help the BARSOUM family, the KIFLE family, and the YOUNES family. The concert given on Sunday December 1, 2019 by the Toronto Welsh Male Voice Choir was distin-

guished by the meticulously prepared program performed by the 30-plus voices in the choir. The choir's sound was warm, confident and nuanced. It really was a marvel to see the singers looking ahead at the conductor as they sang the program from memory. With the eyes of the singers focused on his direction, the conductor, William Woloschuk, was able to shape musical phrases with finesse.

The order of songs carried the audience on an emotional celebration of the secular and sacred aspects of Christmas. It was really delightful how the choir started their performance by proceeding to the front platform from the back of the church singing „Sleigh Ride“. The arrangement of „Mary, Did You Know?“ was particularly effective in expressing the immense significance of Jesus' birth. The following „Suo Gan“ was an example of the distinctive musical Welsh character in its simplicity and beauty of sound from the men's voices. And so the concert progressed to carry the listeners through tonal landscapes that showcased at times the tenor section, the bass section and various solo voices and added percussion effects. The audience participation carols were gloriously expanded by the choir in arrangements that enhanced well-known melodies.



The piano accompanist, Matthew Coons, added sensitive support to the choir in his dynamics at the keyboard and also played well-chosen solos to highlight the Christmas theme. The whole afternoon was so joyful and evoked heartfelt appreciative sentiments from the audience who spontaneously gave the choir a standing ovation. The encore piece „We Rise Again“ secured the choir's power to inspire. Besides the worthy purpose of the concert to raise funds for refugee support, the Toronto Welsh Male Voice Choir left the audience with their gift of music that animated the Christmas spirit.
