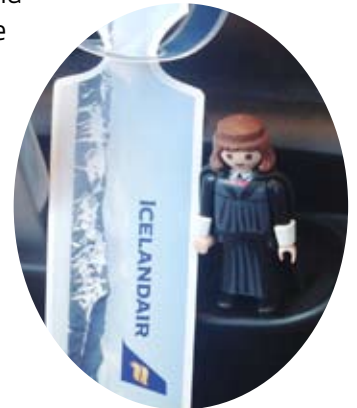

## New Confirmation Classes

After the summer holidays our new confirmation classes begin. The course lasts one year and ends with Confirmation on Pentecost 2017 (the 500 year anniversary of the Reformation!). It is aimed at young people who will be in grade 7 after the summer holidays or who are 12 to 15 years old (exceptions are possible in consultation). The course will be taught in English and German, based on the language ability of confirmands. The confirmands meet once a month at Martin Luther Church from Saturday afternoon until noon Sunday. There will be two three-day weekend retreats, one in the fall and one in the winter. This year's course begins on September 24. There will be a parent's meeting before the first class on September 24 at 2 pm. On Sunday September 25, we will welcome the new confirmands together with their families during the services.

Leaving the closing service of the Eastern Synod Assembly on Sunday, I felt the urge to ride my bike down to the lake and be part of our own congregation. At arrival, Pastor Christian was just about ready for announcements and he asked me to sum up what I had taken from the Assembly. At that time I said: "Be brave! Use your gifts and bravely walk into the world sharing what God has graciously given you."

The closing sermon held by Bishop Michael Pryse (Luke 9, 62) evoked further reflection on my part and

led to the rather absurd questions: How many times do you walk backwards to the grocery store? Or, how many times do you, the driver, drive forward along the highway looking out the rear window? Naturally the answer to both questions is “NEVER”.

I cannot plow my field looking back, nor walk backwards to get things done, nor drive my car as described above. Therefore, if I constantly look back, I miss what God needs me to see and do today. And there is plenty of it because: Salvation; not for sale. Creation; not for sale. Human beings; not for sale. ## Visit from Pastor Ostarek

### Is It That Time Already?

Pastor Claudia Ostarek from the EKD church office will visit us from September 16 to 20. She is responsible for the North American, Asian and Pacific regions. The purpose of her visit is “Visiting and Advising”: At the halfway point of a contract (after three years), congregations and Pastors receive a visit to give mutual feedback and evaluate work done so far. For this reason Pastor Ostarek will be present at the joint service on September 18th at 11 am. There will be an opportunity to have a discussion with her during coffee and cake after the service. At the end, Council will have a meeting with Pastor Ostarek.



## Theological Background

### Reformation Songs

“Now we ask the Holy Spirit for true faith in abundance, that he will keep us until our demise when we go home and leave this misery. Kyrieleis.”

This verse from song number 124 in the Protestant hymn book is mentioned and praised as “quite useful singing” as early as the 13th century. Such one verse songs were very popular for they were among the few hymns that were allowed to be sung at church before the Reformation. These songs were called “Leisen” since they ended with a Kyrieleis.

There is some evidence that Martin Luther chose this song at Pentecost 1524 to add further lyrics. He was in the process of looking for hymns to reshape the German Sunday Service. For that purpose, Luther translated Latin songs into German. In addition, he composed “Leisen” as well as new hymns, often with words from Psalms. Luther continued with a similar format, thus creating an indirect prayer to the Holy Spirit. In his new

verses Luther speaks directly to the Holy Spirit, using “You”, as a divine Counterpart:

*You, precious light, send us your glow,  
teach us to know Jesus Christ alone,  
that we remain in him, the true Savior,  
who brought us to our Father.  
Kyrieleis.*

*You, sweet love, give us your favor,  
let us feel the loving fervor,  
that we love one another with all our hearts  
and remain as one in peace.  
Kyrieleis.*

*You, crucial comfort in all distress,  
Help that we do not fear shame nor death,  
that we do not give up hope,  
when the enemy will beseech us.  
Kyrieleis.*

Moreover, Luther conveys what true faith in God entails. Namely: being comforted in temptation, practicing charity and knowing Jesus Christ at the core.

This precisely outlines Martin Luther's Reformation insight, that Jesus Christ is the center of faith, not our achievements and good deeds. Jesus alone opens heaven's door to the Father and makes us into people of the Kingdom of God without any effort on our part. It is a gift of the Spirit when people realize that. In 1529 Luther wrote in the Small Catechism, in the explanation to the 3rd article which is about the Holy Spirit: I believe

that I cannot be my own reason or strength to believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.
