The goal is set and now it depends on you. Do you accept the challenge? Do you invite others to join you by making plans to attend worship services together?



Lenten Services


Every Thursday at 7pm, Starting on March 14

Evangelical Church in Germany (EKD) Trainings



A Personal Account of the Church Christmas Trees

Last year we once again had two wonderful Christmas trees. Through a joint effort, they were setup, decorated and admired. But so simply put, it sounds easy and even a bit mundane, but so much more happened in the background.

It started in the fall with the request for a tree donation. It didn't take long for a response. Right on time, **Mr. Müller** and **Mr. Grosch** arrived at church with two magnificent trees.

And then the real challenge began. First the trees had to be put up, but where are the stands? After a successful search we could go on. But not so fast. With the help of many volunteers and a makeshift saw we cut the trunk and trimmed a few branches, et voilà. Almost done...

Now artistry, balance and a keen eye were needed, as well as a ladder and two long rods. After the gold stars were placed on top of the Christmas trees, it was time for the lights. Up, no down, a bit to the left, the other left, stop, that's just right!

The trees were standing, the lights were on, only the ornaments were missing. So now we get to the highlight of this entire process. Together we decorated the trees during the candlelight service which was led by our youth. All the white stars, made by congregation members years ago, found a spot on the trees. Finally the white doves, in memory of members who have passed away, were hung.

For two weeks we admired and enjoyed these great trees. Following Epiphany, we took them down, starting with all the white stars. But wait, did we get them all? After the fifth try you could still spot one of the stars left right in front of your nose. Next we could lay the trees down onto a tarp and cut them into pieces, so that they could be picked up from the curb. Once all the needles were cleaned up, the work was done.

Now you have truly mastered the art of the Christmas tree in the Martin Luther Church. And so on to another one next November.

Refugee Support Team—Good News

In the summer of 2018 the MLC Refugee Support Team took on the exciting challenge of forming a community sponsor group for the **Kifle family of six** (Eritreans in an Ethiopia refugee camp) with relative **Tewelde Fessahtsion** and **Christ Church St. James Church**. Together, since September of 2018, we have been able to raise the required \$50,000 and to submit the refugee application

in December. Amazingly, Martin Luther Church raised \$20,000 thanks to a very successful Christmas Bazaar, a well-attended **Toronto Welsh Male Voice Choir** concert, and extremely generous donations from our congregation. Because of your caring commitment, we should be able to welcome the Kifle family to Canada towards the end of 2019.

In addition we have heard from the Canadian Lutheran World Relief that the **Barsoum** and **Younes** families' applications, submitted by their private sponsors with our help, have been accepted and are being processed by the UN visa office. These families should arrive in late 2019 or early 2020.

We also delivered furniture and household items to another refugee family and collected and stored furniture for the Kifle family.

Thank you Martin Luther Church community for your wonderful dedication to supporting our refugees.
