Where is the one in whom I put all my hopes?

There are two men walking down a path, completely overcome with grief. Their thoughts circle around the cross and then back to themselves. Everything they held on to in these past years – was it a lie? Did they put all their hope in the wrong one? How is life supposed to go on now? And then there's also that story of the empty tomb. Clueless they continue on their way to Emmaus.

This feeling of being clueless isn't strange to me. Something happens and it pulls the rug out from under me. Something happens and everything that I believed is called into question. Where is the one in whom I put all my hopes? Where is the one who promised redemption to me?

The disciples aren't alone for long though. Someone appears and takes interest in them. The can tell him what lies so heavy on their hearts. They are so busy with themselves and their grief that they don't realize what's happening. The words which this man speaks don't even get through to them. But what their eyes see: the broken bread, the shared cup – that reaches their hearts; it interrupts their circle of thoughts. Those heavy rocks on their hearts are removed, the overwhelming grief turns into hope. But even more: the two men have new courage: courage to live; courage to believe.

Something happens that surpasses my understanding. Something happens that fascinates and amazes me, every single time, again and again. The encounter that the disciples experienced on this day doesn't leave me unaffected because it shows that everything that happened on the cross, that happened at Easter, is related to me personally. Every single rock that I carry on my heart, everything that takes away my hope and leaves me clueless: Jesus lends an ear to all of this, and it has its place at the Lord's Table, at the table of our saviour.

Lent, Holy Week and Easter - this time tells the story of a lot of things: death and resurrection, grief and hope, despair and new courage. I'm looking forward to sharing this time and everything that comes with it with you. With silent moments and outbursts of courage.

Dear MLC congregation,



Can you imagine two Vicars at the same time in our church?

In June we will welcome a new Vicar from Germany at MLC. Just three months later, in September, a Canadian Vicar will join us for a year. Both are part of the Ecumenical Internship program 2019-2020 which we host together with Redeemer Lutheran Church in the High Park area. With the generous support of the Evangelical Church in Germany and the Mission Committee of the Eastern Synod, both churches together will be able to invite a total of four vicars, working with us over a period of 18 months.

What is the program about?

Martin Luther Church and Redeemer Church are both located in hot spots of urban development in Toronto. The context and people around us are changing at a pace we haven't experienced before. How can we respond to these changes? How can we be church for the people around us? How can we even reach out to people who live in condominium buildings in which we would never get access to mailboxes or door bells? Presumably the number of people who are un- or de-churched is much bigger than the number of people who are looking for a (new) church. How can we find ways to engage these people in Christian faith?

Inspired by the Fresh Expressions of Church movement

we want to experiment boldly with new forms of being church. Embracing the principle that God is already at work in our neighborhood and that we are called to join this mission as we "go to where people are, listen carefully to the context, and through service form new communities of faith" (Bishop Steve Croft, Sheffield)

Both congregations have already begun this missional journey by listening carefully to their context, practicing loving service and trying small initiatives to engage people who are not (yet) members of our congregations. To continue this journey and to raise our initiatives to the next level, more effort is needed. Our vicars will look at the opportunities with fresh eyes and ideas. Together with them we will try out new ideas to reach more people and we will learn better how to be church in the 21st century.

What has happened so far?

For over a year we have worked on grant applications and talked to key people to make this project happen. Now a total budget of about \$145,000 is available for this project of which our congregation will pay less than \$8,500 (already built into our 2019 budget). We have recruited three candidates so far and hope for the fourth person from the Anglican church to get on board soon. In March and April we will begin to form an internship committee which will function as a supporting team, helping the vicars to settle in, assisting them in learning about our neighbourhood and encouraging them to try new projects together, with the goal to make initiatives sustainable beyond this project.

What are the next steps?

After a committee has been formed in both congregations, we will begin to lay out a more detailed roadmap. The church councils of MLC and Redeemer will have a joint meeting in May and approve timelines. Starting in September the internship committee will report monthly to council. In June we will welcome our first vicar and begin our exciting journey together. We will keep you, the congregation, informed – so, stay tuned. And do not worry. In with the new does not mean, out with the old, rather more MLC excellence in our neighborhood. If you have any questions, don't hesitate to ask. We are sure, your input will be valuable for this year of experimenting and learning.

EKD Training Seminar

Dear Congregation,

From 14-17 February, 2019 we took part in a training seminar for church leaders in Hanover, Germany. This seminar was attended by 50 church leaders from German-speaking congregations worldwide, e.g. Bangkok, Beijing, Costa Rica, Hong Kong, Melbourne, México, Nairobi, and almost all European countries. The main topic at this year's conference was "congregational development." We worked together to reflect on our own congregational situations

and attempted to identify potential for development.

Thursday evening's devotion was led by Senior Church Councillor Frank Kopania and the introduction to the seminar run by Dr. Olaf Wassmuth. On Friday, Bishop Petra Bosse-Huber held the morning devotion and subsequent discussion with the participants. Then the regional groups met and formulated concrete questions, suggestions and requests to the EKD. In the afternoon there were various workshop offerings: digital media, member recruitment, Islam/inter-religious dialogue, religion and science, conflict resolution and conflict prevention, household and finance, blessings and wedding services for same-sex couples, postings abroad (6 years), commissions (10 months). We also had an opportunity to converse with Ms. Ostarek and Ms. Schmidt.

On Friday evening Dr. Christina Aus-der-Au gave a presentation: "Participation as a Key Concept of Church development. An Opportunity for EKD Congregations outside Germany as well". On Saturday there was a very interesting workshop on "community development" led by Pastor Cornelia von Stein from Wuppertal. Later, in small groups, we discussed various problems in our congregations as well as our respective experiences. In our group, we discussed the altar reconstruction with members from other countries. On Sunday we attended morning worship in the Hanover Market Church, led by Pastor Hans-Martin Heinemann.

It was four busy days, but we gleaned new inspirations for our congregational development.
