## Open for Advent

As the Christian church turns towards a new year at the beginning of Advent, I have been thinking about what it means to be open: open to new ideas, open to new people, and open to self-reflection. Over the past three months I have been working with the other Vicars on exploring the community around Martin Luther Church and listening to the people who are in the neighbourhood. In early November I happened to be in the front area of the church as three people came to the door, tried to open it, and then left when they found it was locked. I saw them but they left before I was able to greet them, which likely happens often as the pastoral team works in the back offices and most people choose not to ring the doorbell.



As we move into a time of year where we are challenged to be open to new things, I am challenging us to open the church doors more often during this Advent season. The doors will be open from 9:30 am-6 pm during the first week of Advent and the Vicars will work from the front of the church, allowing us to meet the people who are already trying to come through the doors. We will open ourselves up to listening to their needs and hearing what is on their minds. As well, there will be an opportunity for people to gather on every day of Advent for a short time of reflection, song and lighting of a candle to mark the passing of another day as we journey towards Christmas. Please join us Monday to Friday at 5:30 pm and Saturday to Sunday at 12:45 pm from December 1 to 23.

While we are opening the church doors during this season, I also hope that as a congregation we each open ourselves up to change during Advent. May we open ourselves to preparing for God to come into the world as an infant. May we open ourselves to preparing for a new year as we reflect on our journey of faith. May we open ourselves to learning something new: about ourselves, our congregation, and the community that surrounds us.

## When the going gets tough, the tough get going!

### **The experimental phase: Dare to discern, test, fail, get up and try again**

This year it is all about us, the Martin Luther Church: what we are doing to lean into those three big ticket items, and how we dare to discern God's calling for us and for our church. Our focus is definitely on people. In 2019, we gave and are giving eleven young people the chance to work with us and discover how to be church in this century. We provide opportunities for them to learn and do they ever! From a leadership perspective, sometimes it is tough to deal with the outcome once empowerment is triggered. Suddenly questions are raised, the status quo is challenged, and then we all have the opportunity to grow and bravely walk forward as God's people. We are grateful for:

We are experimenting with a new community group in partnership with Stonegate Ministry, the Ladies' Circle by the Lake. A video workshop sparked talent within the Toronto area which now highlights new ministries on-line. We expanded our courage to be missional, as group leaders attended area Lunch and Learn workshops. The pilot project that brought 5 councils from 5 churches together further encouraged leaders to be bold in setting goals for our congregational ministry. As part of our service to the wider community, Vicars Fahl and Smith have been leading midweek services at Lakeshore Lodge twice a month. The spiritual care leader for the Lodge approached Pastor Christian this past summer to see if the congregation would be able to help with these services as another congregation was no longer able to offer a weekly eucharist. The Vicars agreed to offer one service with Communion and one Service of the Word each month to help meet this need. We gather on the first and third Thursday of the month at 10:30am at 3197 Lake Shore Blvd W for prayer, reading of scripture, a short sermon, and hymn singing. Martin Luther Church members are welcome to attend but please check with the office in advance as services are occasionally cancelled due to the needs of the Lodge.

It has been a joy to offer these services to the residents of Lakeshore Lodge and we have heard several times how meaningful it is for them to be able to worship and receive communion on a more regular basis.

## Bible Study

Every 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month we will meet in the pastor's office to read the bible together. For the winter term we will read from the book of Deuteronomy. In this book Moses summarizes his legacy and everything he has learned about God's love for his people before they enter the promised land (without him). 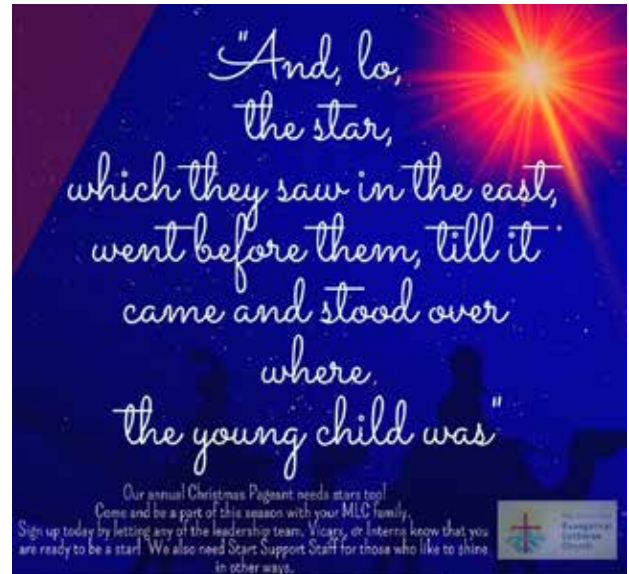
