When one door closes, God points to a window....

We are continuing a series of Sunday reflections inspired by the beautiful stained-glass windows that fill Martin Luther Church with bright colours and shine out like a beacon in our community. I love the windows, I always have. They were one of the first things I noticed in 2019 when I first walked into the church. That feels like lifetimes ago. I have been in and out of the church hundreds of times now, still, the windows catch my eye. When I think about Sundays during the “before times,” I have fond memories of the smell of sugary goodness and coffee wafting up from downstairs. I remember the sound of Linda warming up the organ, the sight of each of you coming in from the cold and slipping out of big jackets while Pastor and I greeted you. I have so many great memories of those Sundays, but somehow when I remember us all there together I can't picture the windows that caught my eye every other day. Perhaps amidst all the Sunday buzz I didn't take the time to stop and soak in the stories they wanted to tell, our stories.

Last year we were all diverted off our usual path onto a detour; a safe route while our usual one is closed. Our detour has given us the chance to slow down, notice the things we miss on our daily commute, it has allowed us, our windows, and our community to tell their stories.



Each window's center image is punctuated with smaller symbols in the corners adding layers to the vignette and helping the story unfold. The Hand of God and the tree of Life, the Ark under a rainbow and an olive branch, the manger and a rose, a Hebrew scroll featuring the words of Isaiah 9 and a crocus. Together they point to our partnership with the Creator, they speak of hope and joy, and ask us to feel the interconnectedness of all living things. It is a story that is profound and poignant.

We live our response with summer students, volunteers from our congregation and community working on projects like “Give Peas a Chance” and other creation-care ministries. We try to get food producing seeds and plants into the hands of all who want to “grow some good” with us, with God, with and for creation. That is what I see in those first windows when I let them tell their story. When we see ourselves in the story, our story, when we find our Ark and marvel at the rainbow, it demands a response. I pray we each find ourselves in the story and respond.

Reopening Info (Reference Point: June 30, 2021)

Ontario is moving through the reopening steps as more people are vaccinated and health improves. It is important to note that as of June 30, 2021, Toronto Public Health still strongly encourages virtual or outdoor services to reduce the spread of COVID-19, and to ensure that everyone can participate safely.

Step 1

	Wedding, funeral, or service	Social gathering
Indoor	15% of room capacity	Not permitted
Outdoor	2m distance apart	10 people or less

Step 2

	Wedding, funeral, or service	Social gathering
Indoor	25% or room capacity	5 people or less
Outdoor	2m distance apart	25 people or less

Even though we are allowed to reopen for in-person worship with limited capacity (step 1- 15%, step 2- 25%), we will continue online with our detour for now. Our understanding of in-person worship includes social gathering. No social gatherings were permitted indoors in Step 1. In Step 2, there can be a maximum of 5 people. We are hoping to reopen on August 15 and we will continue to follow government regulations. God is guiding us on our detour and we trust we will get to the destination soon!

2021-22 Confirmation Class Registration

After the summer holidays our new confirmation classes begin. The course lasts one year and ends with Confirmation during a special worship service. It is aimed at young people who will be in grade 7 after the summer holidays or who are 12 to 15 years old (exceptions are possible in consultation). You can register until the middle of September. 
This home has been a refuge and the staging ground for so many great projects that help me to get my hands dirty in partnership with God. Gifted plants and seeds have produced projects like Give Peas a Chance and yielded a bounty that we have shared with cards saying "From the Parsonage With Love". Our Masks for Good project has seen hundreds of masks, incredible stories, and tonnes of donated resources pass through this house. Growing some good, raising awareness about food insecurity, meeting our neighbours, offering masks, sharing soup, stories, and hope - that is caring for creation, and that is how we at Martin Luther have responded to God's call. That is what I see in those first windows when I let them tell their story.

The parsonage continues to be a blessing and a refuge that allows me, and all of us to respond to God's call. Part of appreciating the home that has allowed this and the community that supports us has been through amazing projects in and around the house. Volunteers like Kai, Dan, and others have taught us skills and empowered us to serve the house that serves so many. The sharing of time, skills, and resources within the Martin Luther community continues to impress and form me.

This house has brought friends together for holidays, birthdays, staged ministries and offered refuge. We have changed tiles, painted walls and decks, planted gardens, and shared from our abundance. This could only happen with so much help and support from the Martin Luther community, one outrageously generous Polish neighbour and one stern but kind Italian one.

Together we are trying to grow some good and get the parsonage ready for our new Pastor and her husband to walk in and feel the love and excitement of this community.

We are also grateful for all the **Masks for Good** volunteers. Hundreds of masks made with love were generously handed out to protect the vulnerable.

More projects are on the way, with the help of our two summer students, **Maliha and Johnny**, to help remedy food insecurity around our church with the planting of two raised beds in front of 5 Superior and the long-awaited food pantry.

We have faced both full and partial closures of our programs at times over the past year and a bit, but we are happy and excited to report that our children and staff are overall safe, healthy and doing very well!

Everyone is looking forward to the summertime! Our school age program, which operates out of the basement of the Church, has been closed again since April 6, 2021, but we just received official word that the program can open again for summer programs on July 5. We are busy accepting new and returning registrations. Feel free to pass the good news on to friends, families, neighbours, etc!

The most exciting news of 2020 was reaching the 50th Anniversary of the childcare centre. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19, we had to defer our celebrations for a future date when it is safe to gather in large groups. We will keep you all posted when a date has been set, as you are all invited to join the celebrations. The child care would not be where and what it is today (i.e. one of the best in Toronto!!!) without the partnership and ongoing support from the church and its members. Thank you all!
