## The joy of giving

Joy - for me this feeling is somehow part of Advent like candlelight and cookies, spending cozy hours with family, preparing and decorating your home for thoughtful and happy moments.

After two years, during which last Christmas season was fraught with social distancing and restrictions, many people are longing for a normalcy. We in the Martin Luther congregation are also carefully and hopefully planning services and events for the next few weeks. And yet we have to be prepared for the fact that these plans may have to be changed again. Looking forward to what is coming without knowing what it will exactly be - this is a challenge!

I therefore find the verse of the month for December from the book of the prophet Zechariah very comforting: Sing and rejoice, O daughter Zion! For lo, I will come and dwell in your midst, says the LORD. (Zechariah 2:10)

Although the prophet himself has gone through difficult times, he does not look back. He does not bury himself in resentment, bitterness and complaining. He reminds me of what Advent is about: Jesus' arrival into the world and into our hearts. God wants to live with us and that is cause for joy! He will come regardless of the circumstances - whether we can meet in church or online in our living rooms. I can trustingly wait and prepare for this - in prayer, in silence, in community with others, while making music or baking. In doing so, I can experience what it personally means to me when God comes to me and lives with me? How can hope for it change my life? Last year the Martin Luther Church answered these questions with the Bowls and Blessings project for people from



our neighborhood, which will take place again in the next few weeks. I'm curious what else we can think of! The conscious waiting for God and the readiness to meet him in our everyday life, that is God's gift for us during Advent. I wish for all of us, especially this year, the joy of receiving something and thereby being inspired to help others.

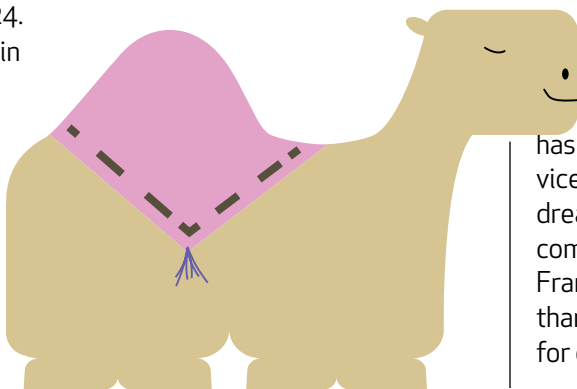
## Welcome Emma, our new Bowls and Blessings coordinator!

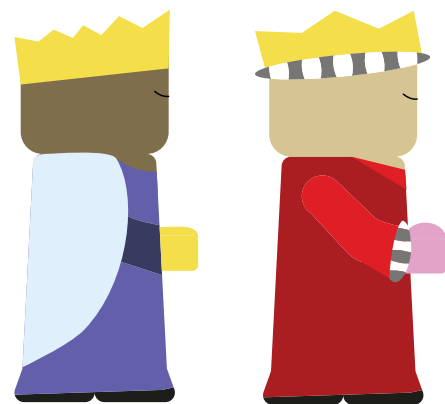

Both Mary Rosto and Ritta Resto, her cousin, have graduated from community college. Several members of their two families have become Canadian citizens. Mary is successfully employed as a Customer Experience Associate at the Toronto Dominion Bank. We congratulate Mary Rosto and Victor Tamras on the occasion of their wedding on November 12!

### A new home for the Barsoum family

After arriving in Canada in August 2020, Ritta Nissan's parents Lahdo and Nayl and brother Fadi Barsoum have moved into their own apartment near their daughter's family.

### The Younes Family's Progress

The six-member Younes family celebrated their one-year anniversary in Canada on October 28. Ibrahim, the father, is teaching Arabic to children online and hopes to get a job very soon. He has gotten his Driver's License and bought a car. His wife Deena is enrolled at Sheridan College in the Early Childhood Education program. Their oldest son is attending Guelph University in microbiology, and Omar is in Grade 12 and will be going to university next year. The two younger ones are loving school and are already very fluent in English. They are all extremely grateful to be in Canada.



### The Kifles are here!

At long last, the Kifle family of six arrived safely in Canada on November 18 from conflict-torn Ethiopia. Although they will now be settling in Kitchener-Waterloo near their brother Tewelde, the joint Refugee Support Teams of Martin Luther Church and Christ Church St. James Anglican will continue to provide settlement and financial assistance as

we are able. We are also delighted with the promise of local assistance and liaison from Pastor Heike Toeller, St. Luke's Evangelical Church in Kitchener. The family continues to be grateful for the significant funds generated by Martin Luther Church back in 2019. These funds have been held for them, and the family will be relying on them during this first year in Canada.



### Refugee Applications in Progress

Along with Canadian Lutheran World Relief, we are also helping the following private sponsors prepare and submit refugee applications for their relatives. We are not responsible for providing twelve-month financial support to them, however, when they arrive we look forward to providing non-financial practical resettlement support (with education and ESL, clothing and furniture donations, finding work, etc).

### Gebrekidan family of five

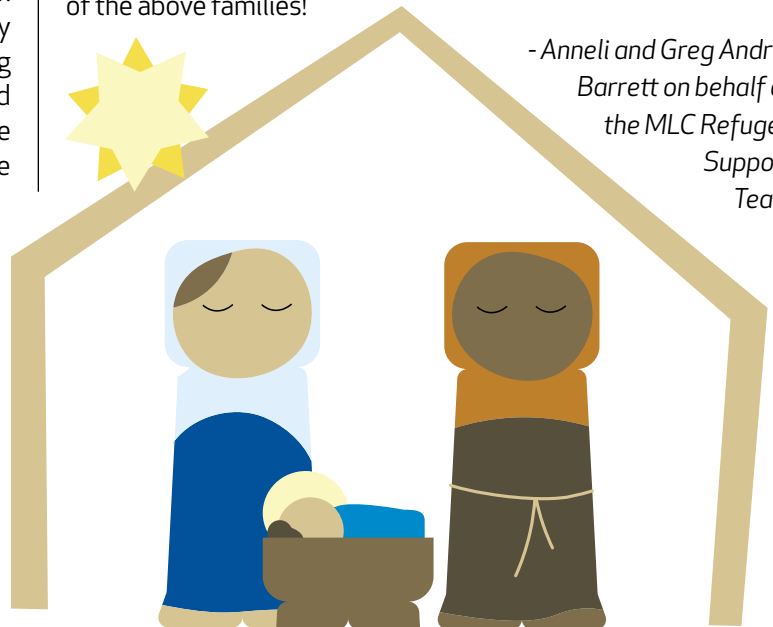
Eritrean refugees now in Sudan. The Sponsor is Melat Beyene. The application is in progress.

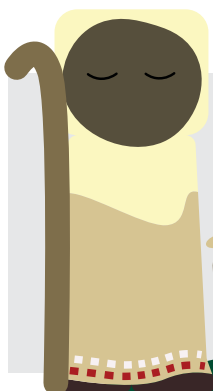
