

Devotion on the Verse for the Month of October

Dear Members and Friends of Martin Luther Church!

To live in abundance, who would not want that?! I hardly know anyone today, who does not want to be rich. People like us growing up in such a materialistic society, are already oriented as children towards being rich as the life goal. – When we were in one of the rebuilt pioneer villages recently, it became clear to us once again, how many things have been in short supplies 100 years ago. At that time, one had to be content to have enough to eat. One had to live off whatever one grew oneself. Sweets, for instance, were rare and education was a luxury. Nowadays, we can hardly imagine any more what it was like. Though I have nothing against rich people, per se, but often, there are terrible excesses. Cars costing millions, wedding gowns studded with diamonds, water faucets covered with 18 carat gold – is that necessary? –Certainly, these are extreme examples, but I believe that

it is our biggest problem, that we have completely lost the connection. In the Bible, riches has a very different meaning. In the verse for the month, God gives riches to the land, the field, so that it will yield a good crop. He who prays this psalm knows that, indeed, not everything depends on his own achievements, but on God's blessing. In the prayer

**You visit the earth
and water it,
you greatly enrich it.**

Psalm 65, 9



he acknowledges that it is God who cares for people and chooses them, it is God who lets it rain and ensures their livelihood. The difference between then and today is, that the person who prays the psalm feels gratitude. Through his faith he knows that he truly cannot take everything for granted. – In October, we even celebrate Thanksgiving twice, the German and the English holiday. Thereby we attempt to establish a connection with the Biblical foundation and the

lifestyle of days gone by, and to win back a perspective which we have lost. We have realized that money does not make us happy and abundance does not satisfy our hunger. The hunger for meaning and love cannot be stilled by riches as we define it. Through faith we discover God's love anew. We perceive how well God takes care of us and, hopefully, we also feel gratitude towards him. In communion with God we will also discover that we can be content with few things, and that material things do not count, but the security which he gives to each person. We

recognize that we are richer than we ever thought, not because we can afford many things, but because we are blest.

Sam and Nicky Lades took care of a tasty menu, Mr. Wieggers donated the cake. We thank the ladies and Mrs Weigelin for the help in the kitchen. Once again, we reflect thankfully on a beautiful Thanksgiving feast.


A Big Thank-You to the Wind Ensemble from Germany and their Hosts!

We once again thank the twelve wind players from Bremen and Nordrhein-Westfalen, that they have undertaken the long journey. A big thank-you also to the host families, especially Daina, Ernie, Anna Lisa and Peter Wienecke, and a few neighbours who were kind enough to accommodate musicians.

Pastor Reichel and his wife Gertrud have paid a brief visit to us on their way from Edmonton to Atlanta. It was nice to see them again. The situation in the day care of the congregation in Brazil is now such that there are public contributions and several Kindergarten teachers could be hired. The church has received an addition, which is, however, not yet completed because of lack of funds. The rooms are designated for Sunday School. The situation is particularly difficult in Guarulhos. Prison revolts and organized crime are extremely bad. Recently, during revolts, 52 busses were set on fire. Time and again, shots of rivalling groups can be heard. One asks oneself, how a person can live and work quietly under such conditions. – On the occasion of this visit, we were able to pass on donations from our congregation in the amount of almost \$ 2,500, which had been collected for Brazil. There is no doubt, Pastor Reichel and his congregation do great work. There is an enormous amount of work to be done. The opportunities to help people are nearly limitless. It is good that we can, through our donations, make an important and meaningful contribution.
