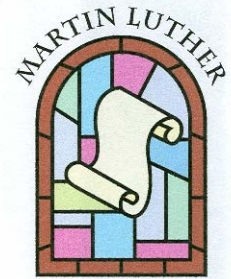

DEVOTION

Dear Fellow Christians !

On Pentecost Sunday, six of our young people were celebrating their confirmation. At the beginning of the worship, the confirmands' choir, led by Iris Schweiger, sang:

"525600 minutes, 525000 moments so dear, 525600 minutes. How do you measure a year? In daylights, in sunsets, in midnights, in cups of coffee, in inches, in miles, in laughter, in strife, in 525600 minutes. How do you measure a year in life? How about love? Measure in love! Seasons of love!"

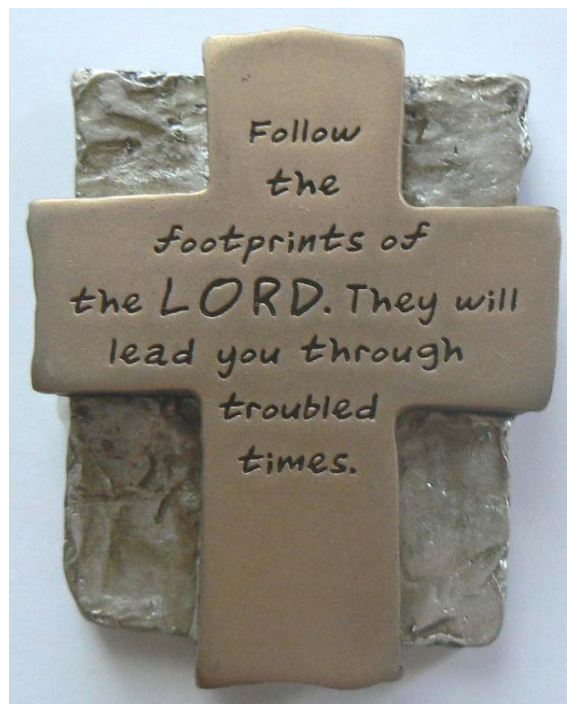
The celebration service was a moment where we looked back on more than 1 million minutes, on a two-year period.

We had fun together, especially in the camps, the first time at Camp Edgewood, where we experienced an exciting Saturday afternoon because of a thunderstorm (for 2 hours there was no electricity, but no further harm was done), or the weekend in Ottawa with visiting the Parliament and Museum of Civilization, enjoying Winterlude and Rideau Channel. And we looked ahead, into a future with major decisions concerning the lives of our confirmands.

The confirmands were presented with bronze crosses in the name of the Martin Luther Church, one having the inscription: "Follow the footprints of the Lord, they will lead you through troubled times." That is

my heartfelt wish for our youth: that they understand what Jesus did for us, that they know his love on the cross and his power in the resurrection. And that they have courage to follow Jesus, Jesus, who can show us a good way for our lives.

And that is clear, they can trust Jesus throughout all their lives. In a book with many church signs from across North America, I had discovered some particularly interesting ones:



"Looking for a lifeguard? Ours walks on water!" This is so special about Jesus: where others sink into fear and despondency, he remains the powerful Lord. If we hold fast to his hand, we are able to endure hardships.

In this age of SMS, Twitter, and Skype a very important note: "Prayer is the best wireless connection."

And another good word: "God takes us as we are and makes us what we can become". Confirmation is only one step on a long road. Just like every Sunday service. We hear God's promise: "You are my beloved child, I am with you." And God has a goal for us: "This is what you are destined for - shape your daily life by God's Word more and more, let your life be transformed by the Spirit more and more."

Please bring your lunch, plate, dishes, cup. Very welcome!

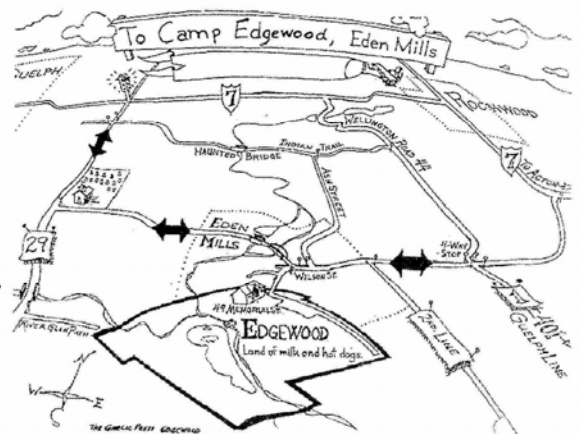

Please come and bring along your Family!!!





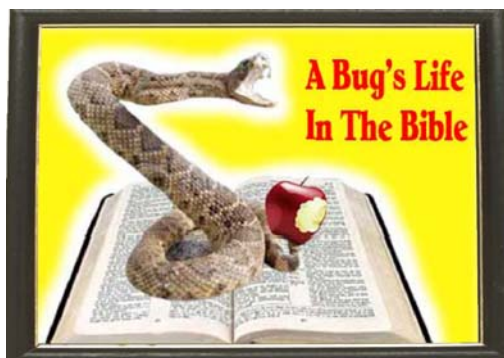

Stay in Germany of Pastor Alexander Mielke, according to the contract with EKD

This summer we will be in Toronto and the MLC for three years already. According to the contract between EKD, MLC and Eastern Synod, the EKD (Evangelical Church in Germany) finances a stay in Germany for me and my family (with a length of 8 weeks, following this contract). So I will be in Germany, and during this time attend an EKD-Overseas-Conference, as well as continuing education courses. Furthermore this vacation, of course, presents a good opportunity to visit family and friends. I am very pleased that Pastor Gerhard Hille will be available as substitute pastor for the greater part of this time. He is the father of Anna Lisa Wienecke and, therefore, quite familiar with the MLC, and I think it is optimal to have permanent substitute pastor to turn to in matters of church services and pastoral care. Through a continuing education course in preaching, which he has attended in Chicago for some time now, he is also well acquainted with the English language. A heartfelt Thank-You to Pastor Hille for his readiness to help! He also will be responsible for bible study and devotions at the summer camp.
