

DEVOTION

Dear Friends in the Martin Luther Church,

This is a day of new beginnings. This phrase will always remind me of that beautiful Easter Sunrise Service that we celebrated earlier this year at Lake Ontario. With this phrase we contemplated Easter as a day of new life, new opportunities and new beginnings that God continues to give us.

A new beginning is also what we are entering now. The old church-year is past, and Advent invites us to start all over again. *Advent* – we are awaiting the coming of God into the world. *Advent* – a time to prepare ourselves for that joy. *Advent* – traditionally a time of repentance and fasting: a time to think about our life, what is important to us, how we want to live as Christians in this world.

A new beginning: That is also the title of the picture you see here. It was designed by the artist Maxine Noel, who was born in Manitoba of Santee Ogla Sioux parents. Her Sioux name, which she signs her artwork with, is IOYAN MANI, which means “Walk Beyond”. What strikes me most about this picture is the sense of comfort and protection that I get from it. There is a new life – fragile and sweet, innocent with its baby-blue mantle and yet stained


with earthy-brown marks, which reveal a shimmer of light in their centre – the same light that the mother carries. The baby and the mother almost meld. However fragile this new life is – it is protected in the loving arms of its mother. Infinite lines cover her

body. The baby is put into the circle of time and life – there is a sense of eternity.

In a couple of weeks we will again celebrate God coming into this world as a vulnerable baby – being born in a simple stable, lying in a manger among dirt and animals. There is no doubt: This baby is very much a part of this world. And yet this baby brings a sense of eternity, of God’s greatness to our lives. Mary is overwhelmed with that greatness, when the angel Gabriel announces her that she is the

chosen one who is supposed to give life to this baby – to this Emmanuel – “God is with us”. The angel says to her: *Do not be afraid! ...Nothing will be impossible with God.*

A new beginning: The picture by Maxine Noel was given to me as a Goodbye-gift from the Etobicoke-Community-Dialogue-Group that I helped to start and worked with during my time here. This gift touches me for various reasons: For one thing, I came to appreciate native art very much while being



here and so this picture will be a special reminder of my time in Canada. Secondly, I feel that God has given me a great opportunity to “Walk Beyond” (IOYAN MANI) – walk beyond the borders of my country and continent, of my church, of my language, of my horizon. Like I wrote in my very first introduction in this newsletter one year ago: *God has set my feet in a broad place* (Ps 31,8). And last but not least: A new beginning - I am starting a new phase in my life – as a pastor in a congregation in Germany. That is exciting, and at the same time it is also a bit scary – like every new beginning is. This picture gives me a strong feeling of comfort. It says

to me: With every new beginning – however frightening and fragile it may be – we have the promise that God surrounds us with his loving arms.

A new beginning: For this Advent and Christmas-Season I wish you a sense of a new beginning that is always possible with the God of comfort and love.

Thank you very much for the time that I spent with you in the Martin Luther Church.

And until we meet again may God hold you in the palm of his hand!
