### **DEVOTION**

Dear Fellow Christians in the Martin Luther Church!

Heavy rain was pouring a couple of weeks ago when I went to the church to conduct the worship services that Sunday (August 7). The front entrance was blocked due to an incredible amount of water. So I was thinking: *Are we going to have a service at all?* I expected our organist Linda to be there along with the church council members who were on duty that day. *That will be awkward*, I thought. *Linda will be* 

sitting at the organ and the council members as usual in the very back. They will be handing out worship bulletins to themselves, lighting the candles for themselves and collecting the offering from ... themselves.

And then that famous bible verse came to my mind. You know the one that we like to use in

church a lot ever since the numbers of people attending the worship services have gone down. By chance it is also the biblical watchword for this month of September: Jesus Christ says: Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them. (Matthew 18,20). And suddenly it was clear to me: Of course we will have a worship service – even with only a couple of people; somebody else will be there with us, too. HE will be there when we light the candles and think of HIM: the light of the world; HE will be there, when we raise our voices to pray and sing to him: the one who promised to answer our prayers; and HE will be there when we give our offerings in HIS name.

With this thought in mind, I had made my peace with a very small congregation that Sunday. But as it turned out I had underestimated the persistency of our congregation members. There was a fair number of people worshipping that Sunday. And – let's face it – the more people sing and pray together the better the worship service will be. That is also the reason why in the Jewish tradition there are supposed to be at least 10 people in a congregation of worshippers (according to the tradition 10 male persons who are at least 14 years old). "There is nothing more powerful than the communion of praying people – it de-

lights the Eternal One" (quote from a German Jewish website: www.de.chabad.org). And still our worship won't be of less value when there are only two or three of us. The value doesn't come with the number. The value comes with the "in my name". Where ever people take to heart the words of Jesus and act according to them Jesus will be right

there with them. Just to say the words *In the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit* does not make us Christians. Discipleship requires more than that - as you can see from the following story:

A poor family from a foreign country moved into a wealthy area. They wore different clothing, had different names and spoke a different language than everybody else. Nevertheless they tried to connect to the people of the community. On Sunday they went to church. Nobody welcomed them, nobody talked to them, and nobody sat with them. But they were persistent. They kept on going to the church – maybe the people just needed time to warm up to them. But even after weeks and weeks nothing changed. So they finally gave up and stopped going to church.



They prayed alone at home. One night the boy of the family prayed to Jesus: Jesus, I am so unhappy, because I am different from those people in the church. They don't let us in to their community. And Jesus answered and said to him: You know what — don't worry about it; they don't let me in either.

Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them. (Matthew 18,20)
